Purpose of the job:

To provide crucial capacity and leadership in identifying, developing and maintaining relationships with partners, beneficiaries and other stakeholders at a local, regional and national level. The Network Manager is instrumental in linking PLAY International with the right people and organisations in Kosovo and the Western Balkans, identifying beneficiaries for project work, and ensuring that PLAY International's work compliments and enhances the existing situation on the ground.

Context of the position:

PLAY International has been active in Kosovo since 2002, using sport to build bridges and promoting peace and reconciliation between communities on a national and international level. New large-scale funding opportunities from 2019 have enabled the Mission to scale up its engagement in the formal and non-formal education sector, with a focus on inclusion, access and retention in school for vulnerable groups, and active education. Working on several complimentary initiatives at the same time, PLAY actively engages local partners and multipliers to ensure sustainability and impact.

Operating with a small, busy, local team PLAY faces challenges in maintaining strong, live relationships with its stakeholders, particularly at the municipal level, as well as creating the optimum local conditions for activity implementation. PLAY's regional ambitions in the Western Balkans will also greatly benefit from a dedicated postholder to identify and secure new partnerships in the most relevant locations.

Main Duties and Responsibilities:

Stakeholder Management and Networking (40%):

- Maintaining active relations through email and face-to-face meetings with key project collaborators and partners (municipal department heads, school leaders, NGO partners, sports clubs, Learning Centres etc.) and donors;
- Keeping key project partners and stakeholders up to date with regular feedback and project progress updates;
- Drafting, sharing and securing renewed or newly established partner agreements / MoUs in a timely and well managed way;
- Positioning PLAY to complement and coordinate with existing and planned actions on the ground at a municipal level;
- Ensuring relevant partners are validated and included in project actions (invitations to trainings / events)
- Identifying and attending relevant events and meetings on behalf of PLAY;

Identification of beneficiaries, partners and locations (35%)

- Identifying new locations, partners and beneficiaries for projects in consultation with Programme Manager;
- Positioning PLAY for collaboration and cooperation with relevant stakeholders in new project locations
- Maintaining an active awareness of local activities and initiatives which can affect PLAY's work
- Supporting the project and pedagogy team in organising and securing participation of beneficiaries in project activities (trainings etc).



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Project design, Monitoring, Evaluation and Learning (10%)

- Contribute to project conception and design
- Actively participate in planning, evaluation and review sessions led by the project team to continually improve the outcomes of PLAY International's work
- Contributing to project MEL with key project stakeholders (interviews with head teachers, municipal officers etc)

Administration and Information Knowledge Management (10%)

- Maintaining all relevant systems for managing partner and beneficiary contact details;
- Building and maintaining an online library of documentary resources (research, statistics, municipal
 action plans etc) aimed at enhancing PLAY's ability to understand the needs and challenges facing
 the places where it works;

Senior Management Team (5%)

- Play an active and dynamic role in the SMT to contribute to the overall success of the Mission;
- Attend and contribute to SMT weekly coordination and any other meetings as required;
- May be required to line manage one or more coordinators.

Key Relationships:

Internal: Head of Mission, Project Manager, Pedagogical Manager, Senior Coordinator.

External: Municipal representatives, local civil society organisations, partner organisations and institutions (Universities, Learning Centres, National Olympic Committee etc), head teachers, sport animators, youth volunteers.

Other important features or requirements of the job

A willingness to develop and grow skills and experience through training, collaboration with colleagues and initiative.

As a key interface with PLAY's external partners and stakeholders, the post requires a high degree of mobility and travel within Kosovo and around the Western Balkans.

Operational project work requires occasional (or sometimes regular) work outside normal hours, for example in the evenings or at weekends.
